Absences


If your child is sick, please call the school office at 03 4640065. All absences are followed up by 9:15 a.m. If you have an appointment during the day, please sign your child out from the office.

Our active Parents Group organises events and fundraisers for our kura. We welcome new members, keep an eye out in the newsletter for more information.






Lunch orders

You can order your child's lunch through Lunchonline.co.nz. There are many options available, and the lunch order is delivered to the school office.




Karakia


Wellness and wellbeing

Our school newsletter is emailed every Friday at 2:30pm, please read it and make a note of the important events and dates.




SeeSaw
